I am writing in response to your email dated 1st December 2020 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding prescribing information.

On the same day we contacted you via email as we required a timeframe in order to collate the information.

On 7th December 2020 you replied via email with the following:
"We are looking for current prescribing data, the number of patients that are currently being prescribed the below medications as up to date as possible."

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

Q1 I am writing to request the following information regarding the following prescribing information and Blueteq forms.

Number of patients prescribed evolocumab and the indication (familial hypercholesterolaemia, primary non-familial hyperlipidaemia, mixed dyslipidaemia)

A1 We are unable to provide the information you require in the requested format as to release this data could lead to the identification of the person(s) involved due to the low numbers involved, and would breach the Trusts obligations under Data Protection Act 2018. Accordingly, this aspect of your request is exempt from disclosure under the terms of Section 40(2) of the FOI Act. *Personal information*. However as the Trust is committed to openness and transparency we can band the numbers as being <5.

This exemption is an absolute exemption and therefore no consideration of the public interest test is needed.

- familial hypercholesterolemia = <5 current patients
- primary hypercholesterolaemia and mixed dyslipidaemia = 5 current patients

Q2 Number of patients prescribed alirocumab and the indication (familial hypercholesterolaemia, primary non-familial hyperlipidaemia, mixed dyslipidaemia)

A2 We are unable to provide the information you require in the requested format as to release this data could lead to the identification of the person(s) involved due to the low numbers involved, and would breach the Trusts obligations under Data Protection Act 2018. Accordingly, this

aspect of your request is exempt from disclosure under the terms of Section 40(2) of the FOI Act. *Personal information*. However as the Trust is committed to openness and transparency we can band the numbers as being <5.

This exemption is an absolute exemption and therefore no consideration of the public interest test is needed.

- Combined hyperlipidaemia = <5 current patients
- familial hypercholesterolaemia = <5 current patients
- Hypercholesterolaemia = 5 current patients
- Primary hypercholesterolaemia and mixed dyslipidaemia = 19 current patients
