I am writing in response to your email dated 2nd October 2018 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding winter planning

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

- As part of their winter planning, Worcestershire Acute Trust has identified that 200 extra beds will be needed this winter to avoid excessively high occupancy rates. I would therefore like to know:
 - a) Has the Trust made any assessment of how many extra beds it will need to cope with demand this winter (and if so, how many)
- A1 The Trust as assessed that the gap for beds is 171
- Q2 Will the Trust be increasing its bed stock as appropriate to meet the increased level of demand?
- A2 Along with local Health and Social Care Partners the Trust is increasing its bed stock to meet the gap. The Trust is increasing its bed stock by 64
- Q3 If so, has this been costed (please include financial estimates where possible/relevant)
- A3 The Capital costs for the 64 beds is £10.532m. There is no revenue cost.
