I am writing in response to your email dated 9th August 2019 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding hate speech in hospitals.

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

- Q1 How many formal complaints were made to the NHS/ to the hospital by members of staff or patients, about hate speech in?
 - a) 2016
 - b) 2017
 - c) 2018
 - d) 2019?

If you have the data, I would like a full breakdown of the statistics surrounding these cases, for instance the number of cases of islamophobia, sexism, racism, etc.

A1 The Trust uses an incident management system called "Datix" and after conducting a search of this system using the key words that you have supplied we can find no complaints made to the to the hospital by members of staff or patients, about hate speech for years requested.

Please note: For complaints raised under the Trust's Dignity at Work Policy, every attempt is made to resolve the complaint at the lowest possible level and at the earliest possible stage wherever possible. As complaints are raised and resolved informally, they are not recorded formally. Where any action is required, the matter is dealt with in accordance with the Trust Disciplinary Policy.

- Q2 How many people in the NHS / hospitals were disciplined for hate speech in?
 - a) 2016
 - b) 2017
 - c) 2018
 - d) Any available data for 2019?

If you have the data, I would like a full breakdown of the statistics surrounding these cases, for instance the number of cases of islamophobia, sexism, racism, etc.

A2 We are unable to provide the information you require in the requested format as to release this data could lead to the identification of the person(s) involved due to the low numbers involved, and would breach the Trusts obligations under the Data Protection Act 1998. Accordingly, this







aspect of your request is exempt from disclosure under the terms of Section 40(2) of the Act. However as the Trust is committed to openness and transparency we can band the numbers of staff who were disciplined as per the table below
