I am writing in response to your email dated 25th March 2021 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding our response to your Foi on cord -clamping

You emailed:

"Can I just clarify are you saying you don't record the cord clamping time in any paper notes, which is what the foi was asking for you to audit?"

The University Hospitals of North Midlands Trust is committed to the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

However, the NHS is facing unprecedented challenges relating to the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic at the current time. Understandably, our resources have been diverted to support our front-line colleagues who are working tremendously hard to provide care for our patients, and to those in need of our services.

We strive to be transparent and to work with an open culture. But at this time, whilst care of our patients and the safety of our staff takes precedent, it is likely that responses to some requests for information will be delayed. We apologise for this position in advance, and will endeavour to provide you with as much information as we can, as soon as we are able.

The Information Commissioners Office has recognised the current situation in the NHS

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

- Q1 Thank you for your reply, to make sure it is under the cost limit:
 - 1. Please select a number of notes at random for the past 12 months.

Please tell me if the baby was term (over 37 weeks) or premature And if the cord -clamping time was:

- 1. At 60 seconds or more
- 2. Less than 60 seconds







3. Or not recorded

Please do this for the maximum number of patients under the allowed cost implication.

Amended answer:

We are unable to provide the information you require in the requested format as to release this data could lead to the identification of the person(s) involved due to the low numbers involved, and would breach the Trusts obligations under Data Protection Act 2018. Accordingly, this aspect of your request is exempt from disclosure under the terms of Section 40(2) of the FOI Act. *Personal information*. However as the Trust is committed to openness and transparency we can band the numbers as being <5

This exemption is an absolute exemption and therefore no consideration of the public interest test is needed.

New electronic maternity system introduced late 2017

Caveat:

- Where cord clamping has been done prior to 1minute there is clinical justification, such as: Resus, Preterm, Twin delivery, C-Section
- Where cord clamping is not recorded this is primarily due to Home births / Born before arrival / born in non-delivery locations







• Where Unknown gestation is noted – this is typically a result of concealed pregnancies, and where the mother hadn't previously booked their care with us
