I am writing in response to your email dated 25th May 2018 (received into our office 29th May) requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding caesarean section delivery.

On 13th June 2018 we contacted you via email as we required clarification on what you meant by effected? Q1 (a)

On 13th June 2018 (received into our office 14th June) you replied via email the following: "Effected' means carried out, accomplished, brought about, i.e. the standard Oxford dictionary definition of the word. We trust that you will respond within the original 20 day timescale"

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

Q1 Between 21:45 hours on 27 February 2013 and 01:45 hours, on 28 February 2013 how many theatres were in operation for caesarean section delivery?

During the aforesaid times/dates, please specify: -

- a) The number of caesarean section deliveries effected?
- b) The timing of each caesarean section delivery and the category applied to each e.g. Grade 1/Grade II etc.
- c) The number of Consultant Obstetricians staffing the labour ward?
- d) The number of Consultant Obstetricians staffing the theatres?
- e) Were the labour and delivery suite and/or operating theatres short staffed and if so in what respect?
- f) Were there any unusual circumstances prevailing in the labour and delivery suite and/or operating theatres between the aforesaid times/ that caused or contributed to delays in patients being clinically assessed and also deliveries in theatre?

c)	The number of Consultant Obstetricians staffing the labour ward?	The Trust always has one Consultant on-call
d)	The number of Consultant Obstetricians staffing the theatres?	As above
e)	Were the labour and delivery suite and/or operating theatres short staffed and if so in what respect?	The Trust ensures that Theatre staffing is adequate and also have an escalation process to ensure the provision of safe staffing
f)	Were there any unusual circumstances prevailing in the labour and delivery suite and/or operating theatres between the aforesaid times/ that caused or contributed to delays in patients being clinically assessed and also deliveries in theatre?	From our acuity tool we were detailed as level three escalations. We did not need to obtain help from other areas during the time points detailed. We had a dedicated theatre team during the time points detailed.

- Q2 As at 27/28 February 2013, did the Hospital have a policy/guideline/protocol in respect of the following and if so, kindly provide copies:
 - a) Assessment/management of pregnant patients upon identification of growth of Streptococcus B.
 - b) Assessment/management in the third trimester upon identification of reduced foetal movement.
 - c) Assessment/management in the third trimester upon identification of foetal tachycardia.
 - d) Assessment/management in the third trimester upon identification of meconium stained amniotic fluid.
 - e) Calling for medical review in the third trimester upon identification of a suspicious CTG.
 - f) Undertaking ARM in relation to the MAU.
 - g) Undertaking foetal blood sampling.
 - h) Categorising degree of urgency for caesarean section delivery.
 - i) The time interval between decision to deliver by Caesarean section and actual delivery.
