I am writing to acknowledge receipt of your email dated 25th May 2022 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding International Nurse Recruitment

The University Hospitals of North Midlands Trust is committed to the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

However, the NHS is facing unprecedented challenges relating to the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic at the current time. Understandably, our resources have been diverted to support our front-line colleagues who are working tremendously hard to provide care for our patients, and to those in need of our services.

We strive to be transparent and to work with an open culture. But at this time, whilst care of our patients and the safety of our staff takes precedent, it is likely that responses to some requests for information will be delayed. We apologise for this position in advance, and will endeavour to provide you with as much information as we can, as soon as we are able.

The Information Commissioners Office has recognised the current situation in the NHS.

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

- Q1 Under the Freedom of Information Act, details in respect to any international nurse recruitment undertaken by the Trust. Specifically, can the Trust answer the following?
 1. How many Nurses did the Trust recruit internationally in the period 2019-2021?
- A1 91
- Q2 Please can the Trust detail the split of these Nurses by specialism / discipline / band?
- A2 See below:
 - 44 assigned to Medicine Division
 - 28 assigned to Specialised Division (9 assigned to critical care pod 1&2)
 - 19 assigned to Surgery Division (6 in theatres and 4 in critical care)







All international nurses were recruited into a band 3 role initially. Upon successful completion of a NMC Test of Competence they were then converted to band 5 roles as registered nurses

Q3 Please provide the number of international Nurses provided by each supplier in this period?

- A3 All our nurses were recruited though the following
 - Global Learning
 - Medline
 - Pertemps
- Q4 What is the spend per supplier for international Nurse Recruitment?
- A4 The spend total was £916,308.41
- Q5 Which framework(s) does the Trust use for international recruitment of Nurses?
- A5 Global Learning was part of a NHS organisation so was supplier to supplier. Health Trust Europe Total Workforce Solutions II
- Q6 Can the Trust confirm whether the contracts in place were tendered for via a framework mini competition (or direct call-off) or open procedure?
- A6 Direct Award in accordance with the H.T.E TWS II framework
- Q7 Per respective tender please confirm the suppliers who applied for inclusion and were / were not successful?
- A7 Not applicable
- Q8 Could you please provide a copy of the tender specification given to all bidders for when this contract was last advertised?
- A8 Not applicable
- Q9 Start date and duration (including extensions) of any contracts in place for international recruitment services for Nurses?
- A9 The agreement was completed with the arrival of the nurses. There is a 12 month agreement in place with Medline and Pertemps from 01/04/22
- Q10 Has a decision been made yet on whether the framework(s) / contract(s) are being either extended or renewed?
- A10 Global Learning are no longer accessible, no decision have been made on renewal
- Q11 Who is the key procurement contact in procurement and senior officer (outside of procurement) responsible for the contract(s)?
- A11 Joanne Roberts* Deputy Director of Procurement
