I am writing in response to your email dated 15th February 2021 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding Covid 19.

The University Hospitals of North Midlands Trust is committed to the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

However, the NHS is facing unprecedented challenges relating to the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic at the current time. Understandably, our resources have been diverted to support our front-line colleagues who are working tremendously hard to provide care for our patients, and to those in need of our services.

We strive to be transparent and to work with an open culture. But at this time, whilst care of our patients and the safety of our staff takes precedent, it is likely that responses to some requests for information will be delayed. We apologise for this position in advance, and will endeavour to provide you with as much information as we can, as soon as we are able.

The Information Commissioners Office has recognised the current situation in the NHS

I can neither confirm nor deny whether the information you have requested is held by the Trust in its entirety. This is because the information requested in question 3 is not held centrally, but may be recorded in individual health records. In order to confirm whether this information is held we would therefore have to individually access all health records within the Trust and extract the information where it is present. We therefore estimate that complying with your request is exempt under section 12 of the FOI Act: cost of compliance is excessive. The section 12 exemption applies when it is estimated a request will take in excess of 18 hours to complete. We estimate that accessing and reviewing all health records and then extracting relevant information would take longer than the 18 hours allowed for. In addition to the section 12 exemption the Trust is also applying section 14 (1) exemption: oppressive burden on the authority

Under section 16 of the FOI Act we are required to provide requestors with advice and assistance where possible. We would therefore like to advise you that if your request is shortened to just the questions that we are able to comply within the 18 hour time frame. In order to avoid delay to your response we have provided this below.

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.







- Q1 I am writing to you under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 to request the following information from your Trust:
 - The number of pregnant women your Trust has treated for Covid-19 between 1st March 2020 and 31st January 2021?
- We have had 53 women who have tested positive in this time frame however the majority are with incidental findings on routine PCR or have been symptomatic but come in with an obstetric problem, not directly related to COVID. Less than five have been treated primarily due to COVID
- Q2 The number of pregnant women your Trust has treated in ICU for Covid-19 between 1st March 2020 and 31st January 2021?
- A2 Nil
- Q3 The number of women who had recently given birth that required treatment for Covid-19 by your Trust between 1st March 2020 and 31st January 2021?
- A3 Section 12 exemption as detailed above
- Q4 The number of women that had recently given birth and required treatment for Covid-19 in ICU at your Trust between 1st March 2020 and 31st January 2021?
- We are unable to provide the information you require in the requested format as to release this data could lead to the identification of the person(s) involved due to the low numbers involved, and would breach the Trusts obligations under Data Protection Act 2018. Accordingly, this aspect of your request is exempt from disclosure under the terms of Section 40(2) of the FOI Act. Personal information. - We are unable to provide the information you require in the requested format as to release this data could lead to the identification of the person(s) involved due to the low numbers involved, and would breach the Trusts obligations under Data Protection Act 2018. Accordingly, this aspect of your request is exempt from disclosure under the terms of Section 40(2) of the FOI Act. *Personal information*. However as the Trust is committed to openness and transparency we can band the numbers <5

Q8 The number of pregnant workers in your Trust (employees, agency workers, selfemployed or locum) that are currently in patient-facing roles?

A8 The Trust does not record whether staff are pregnant. Staff absent from work due to maternity leave is recorded. The Trust does not record whether agency or other workers may be pregnant
