I am writing to acknowledge receipt of your email dated 18th October 2024 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding enabled virtual wards

Q1 What is the current reported virtual wards beds capacity?

- A1 Based on both sites the bed capacity is 40 acute virtual ward beds and 130 sub-acute virtual wards
- Q2 Out of this capacity, what number/percentage are enabled for remote patient monitoring?
- A2 As the patients are acute frailty up to 30% are enabled for remote monitoring for acute virtual wards and over 70% for the sub-acute for high-risk patients
- Q3 What is the current utilisation percentage specifically for the virtual ward beds that are enabled for remote patient monitoring (rather the overall utilisation including used for face-to-face consultations)?
- A3 It fluctuates but latest NHSE Foundary submission is 7/12 (58%) of the patients on the acute ward and 85/91 (93%) on the sub-acute virtual wards
- Q4 Does the utilisation of the remote patient monitoring-enabled virtual ward beds fluctuate over time? If so, could you provide an average percentage or a breakdown of utilisation across different time periods?
- A4 Acute Wards average around 60% of the remote monitored beds are being utilised Sub-Acute Wards – average around 85% of the remote monitored beds are being utilised
- Q5 If you are unable to provide the utilisation percentage(s), could you explain the process used to capture and measure the utilisation of the remote patient monitoring-enabled virtual beds?
- A5 Percentages included above
