I am writing in response to your email dated 6<sup>th</sup> May 2018 (received into our office 8<sup>th</sup> May) requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding Microsoft Licensing.

As of 1<sup>st</sup> November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

- Q1 Does your organisation have a Microsoft volume licensing agreement in place?
- A1 The Trust does have a Microsoft volume licensing agreement in place but only for a small 250 user (proof of concept (POC))
- Q2 If yes, to 1. above, what type of volume license agreement(s) is it. For example (but not limited to) Subscription, Enterprise Wide Agreement, Office 365. Please list all agreements types if you have more than one
- A2 The Trust has a VLA for Office 365 for 250 users
- Q3 For each volume licensing agreement, what is the yearly contract value (please not exemption due to commercial sensitivities is not applicable here as this information should already be made public
- A3 £11,000
- Q4 For each volume licensing agreement, please provide detailed list of licenses descriptions, SKU's and their quantities
- A4 The Trust has 250 licenses for Office 365
