## Dear

I am writing in response to your email dated 26<sup>th</sup> August 2020 (received into our office 27<sup>th</sup> August) requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding Trust guidelines

As of 1<sup>st</sup> November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

Q1 As part of my research I require some information which will assist me in writing my thesis.

Please could I have copies of any clinical guidelines and referral criteria/pathways used by MWs for referring women for perinatal mental health care; and also any perinatal mental health training materials that is relevant to the MWs within your Trust?

Attached is the current working guideline - Achieving Sustainable Quality in Maternity Services (ASQUAM) Perinatal Mental Health Guideline. This is currently being updated in line with NICE Antenatal and postnatal mental health: clinical management and service guidance Clinical guideline [CG192]

Perinatal Mental Health Training is not currently on the annual mandatory training day, but this is being reviewed by the Trust

## Please also note:

There is a midwife with specialist interest in mental health within the directorate who is supported by a mental health nurse with an obstetrician lead. They provide support and advice to women who are not currently engaged with mental health services but require some enhanced care and refer to voluntary agencies and others. They offer telephone and face to face appointments for twice weekly clinics. They will also review and support women as inpatients needing low level intervention and support referral to the acute mental health response team as required. The midwife also liaises with the Parent and Baby day unit as part of the MDT to ensure that care plans are shared for any pregnant women coming to UHNM. This has been a significant and positive step towards collaborative multi agency working. A bid by perinatal mental health services supported by maternity and as part of the Maternity transformation funds, has been submitted to enhance mental health support for women with tocophobia and birth trauma.
