I am writing in response to your email dated 22nd August 2019 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding PFI scheme.

I can neither confirm nor deny whether the information you have requested is held by the Trust in its entirety. This is because the information requested in questions 2 and 4 is not held centrally, but may be recorded in individual departmental records. In order to confirm whether this information is held we would therefore have to individually access all individual departmental records within the Trust and extract the information where it is present. We therefore estimate that complying with your request is exempt under section 12 of the FOI Act: cost of compliance is excessive. The section 12 exemption applies when it is estimated a request will take in excess of 18 hours to complete. We estimate that accessing and reviewing all individual departmental records and then extracting relevant information would take longer than the 18 hours allowed for.

In addition to the section 12 exemption the Trust is also applying section 14 (1) exemption: oppressive burden on the authority

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

- Q1 Please can I request under the Freedom of Information Act the following information in relation to the Royal Stoke University Hospital Private Finance Initiative deal?
 - 1) The projected total (whole life) cost of the scheme, in £, detailed when the scheme was first agreed (i.e. the original projected cost of all Unitary Charge Payments over the full life of the scheme).
- A1 Commercially sensitive information relating to the Royal Stoke University Hospital Private Finance Initiative deal has not been disclosed as we consider that under section 43(2) of the FOI Act: prejudice to the commercial interests of any party, is engaged. Disclosure of this information could be commercially detrimental to the Trust and companies acting on our behalf and result in less competitive prices for services. The likely consequence of this would be increased cost for service provision to the Trust. We have considered how the public interest might apply, and although recognising that there is a strong public interest in openness there is a greater public interest ensuring an ability to obtain best value for money.







Q2 The projected total (whole life) cost of the scheme, in £, as at August 1, 2019 (i.e. the real cost for previous years and projected cost for future years of all Unitary Charge Payments over the full life of the scheme).

If there is a difference between 1 and 2, please can you provide details of?

- A) The date(s) the projected costs changed
- B) The reason(s) the projected costs changed
- As answer 1, in addition the Trust is applying sections 12 and 14 exemptions as detailed above.
- Q3 A copy of the original contract/agreement;
- A3 As answer 1
- An itemised list of any payments made to the PFI contractors for services not included in the original PFI deal, from the beginning of the deal to the current date, and to include exact details of what was being paid for.
- As answer 1, in addition the Trust is applying sections 12 and 14 exemptions as detailed above.
