I am writing in response to your email dated 20<sup>th</sup> November 2019 (received into our office 21<sup>st</sup> November) requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding Bounty UK Limited

As of 1<sup>st</sup> November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

- Whether the Trust currently is, or has been in the past 12 months, engaged in a contract or written agreement with Bounty UK Limited. If the Trust is currently engaged in a contract please attach a copy of it, making necessary redactions in order to comply with the Act. Please provide the date that the contract began and/ or ended. Please provide an overview of the terms of payment. (i. e. per mother visited / per photo pack purchased).
