I am writing in response to your email dated 11<sup>th</sup> November 2019 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding of incidents that have been recorded on DATIX

As of 1<sup>st</sup> November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

With regard to this part of your request, we regret to inform you that University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust takes the view that some of this information is exempt from disclosure in accordance with section 41(1)(a) and (b) of the 2000 Act. The reason why the Trust takes this view is because the numbers are low. With this, and any other publicly

available information, the public could identify the deceased or other living persons identifiable through association. In addition we are also applying Section 40(2) of the FOI Act. *Personal information*. However as the Trust is committed to openness and transparency we can band the numbers, and have provided this below.

*This exemption is an absolute exemption and therefore no consideration of the public interest test is needed.*

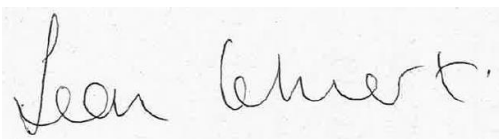
