I am writing in response to your email dated 21st December 2018 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding Trust policy for compounded bevacizumab routinely available to treat wet age-related macular degeneration.

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

Q1 I am writing to make a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act.

1) Does your Trust have, or intend to introduce, a policy that makes compounded bevacizumab routinely available to treat wet age-related macular degeneration?
