## Dear

I am writing in response to your email dated 20<sup>th</sup> November 2018 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding hard and soft Facilities Management. I sincerely apologise for the delay in responding.

As of 1<sup>st</sup> November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

- Q1 Please would you be able to tell me which providers you use for your hard and soft Facilities Management and what the annual contract values are, and how long is left on the contracts?
- A1 Some Commercially sensitive information relating to hard and soft Facilities Management has not been disclosed here as we consider that under section 43(2) of the FOI Act: *prejudice to the commercial interests of any party*, is engaged. Disclosure of this information could be commercially detrimental to the Trust and companies acting on our behalf and result in less competitive prices for services. The likely consequence of this would be increased cost for service provision to the Trust. We have considered how the public interest might apply, and although recognising that there is a strong public interest in openness there is a greater public interest ensuring an ability to obtain best value for money.

However we can state the following:

County Hospital (Stafford) not applicable as we have in-house services for Hard and Soft FM Management.

Royal Stoke Site: - I can confirm that the Trust holds information regarding which providers we use for your hard and soft Facilities Management, but feel some of this information is exempt under section 21: *information reasonably accessible by other means*.
