## Dear

I am writing to acknowledge receipt of your email dated 3<sup>rd</sup> June 2022 (received into our office 6th June) requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding weed killer.

The University Hospitals of North Midlands Trust is committed to the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

However, the NHS is facing unprecedented challenges relating to the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic at the current time. Understandably, our resources have been diverted to support our front-line colleagues who are working tremendously hard to provide care for our patients, and to those in need of our services.

We strive to be transparent and to work with an open culture. But at this time, whilst care of our patients and the safety of our staff takes precedent, it is likely that responses to some requests for information will be delayed. We apologise for this position in advance, and will endeavour to provide you with as much information as we can, as soon as we are able.

The Information Commissioners Office has recognised the current situation in the NHS.

As of 1<sup>st</sup> November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

  - What is your policy for weed control in the hospital's grounds?
  - Do you use herbicides containing glyphosate eg Roundup, Weedol etc If yes, what do you use
  - What areas have been sprayed with herbicides containing glyphosate?
  - What is your policy on the use of glyphosate?
  - What precautions were taken ahead of its use?
  - For the calendar years 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021 and 2022, please can you tell me:

A1 The answers to the questions posed are relevant to County Hospital site.

Yes products containing glyphosate have been used on site, since 2018 to present. Motif and Round up Provantage have been used respectively. Areas sprayed include car parks building parameters and planted borders where appropriate.

Policy is Manufacturers guide lines are followed. In compliance with health and safety recommendations.

Environmental checks are undertaken prior to use these include weather checks ground conditions etc.
