I am writing in response to your email dated 6th November 2018 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding the Hip and Knee Group.

I can neither confirm nor deny whether the information you have requested is held by the Trust in its entirety. This is because some the information requested in question 1 (b) is not held centrally, but may be recorded in individual health records. In order to confirm whether this information is held we would therefore have to individually access all health records within the Trust and extract the information where it is present. We therefore estimate that complying with your request is exempt under section 12 of the FOI Act: *cost of compliance is excessive*. The section 12 exemption applies when it is estimated a request will take in excess of 18 hours to complete. We estimate that accessing and reviewing all health records and then extracting relevant information would take longer than the 18 hours allowed for.

Under section 16 of the FOI Act we are required to provide requestors with advice and assistance where possible. We would therefore like to advise you that your request is shortened to just the questions that we are able to comply within the 18 hour time frame. In order to avoid delay to your response we have provided this below

On 7th November 2018 we contacted you via email as we required the following clarification:

- a) Please give examples of any other costs you are referring to.
- b) Are you referring to the purchase of a laptop/projector or the cost of renting a room with one provided?

On the same day you replied via email with the following:

- "a) 'any other costs involved' by this I meant any extra costs involved with the current Total hip and total knee replacement group such as administration, transport and equipment ie) elbow crutches to be issued to patients.
- b) I am referring to the costs of renting a room with a projector and laptop."

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.







I am in my third year of studying Physiotherapy at Keele University. I am currently on a 6 week placement at the elective orthopaedic unit at the County Hospital in Staffordshire. I am currently writing an assignment for a service improvement that aims to run a group before patients undergo total hip and knee replacements that live in the Stone and Stafford area. I am aware that such a group currently exists and is carried out at Stoke hospital but often attendance is poor due to the distance required to travel by some patients from such areas. I therefore kindly ask if I could acquire some statistics of County hospital and Stoke hospital from the Trust:

Stoke Hospital

Current costs involved in running the Hip and Knee Group- i.e.):

- Current Cost of an administration team that send the patients an invitation letter to the group
- Price of Technician Band 4 that holds the session
- Price of hiring out the room currently
- Any other costs involved
- At UHNM all patients have to be referred to the education group by their Consultant. They will then be sent an invite letter to attend a group education session. We do have patients who contact us to discuss their personal circumstances and if they are unable to attend we will aim to either, arrange a 1:1 session or complete a telephone assessment.

UHNM have between 60-80 patients referred per month currently attending the education group with a Did Not Attend (DNA) rate of 4%. Patients from Stone and Stafford currently attend the group and we have had no complaints on there being no group at the County Hospital site.

We continue to monitor the efficiency of the group in line with staffing resources and if the number of patients located near to the County Hospital site were to increase to a viable number to ensure that the service was cost effective we would look to implement the same service on the County Hospital site.
