I am writing to acknowledge receipt of your email dated 07.05.21 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding Medical Locums / Agency Doctors.

The University Hospitals of North Midlands Trust is committed to the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

However, the NHS is facing unprecedented challenges relating to the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic at the current time. Understandably, our resources have been diverted to support our front-line colleagues who are working tremendously hard to provide care for our patients, and to those in need of our services.

We strive to be transparent and to work with an open culture. But at this time, whilst care of our patients and the safety of our staff takes precedent, it is likely that responses to some requests for information will be delayed. We apologise for this position in advance, and will endeavour to provide you with as much information as we can, as soon as we are able.

The Information Commissioners Office has recognised the current situation in the NHS

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

- Q1 I am writing under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) to request the following information:
 - 1. What contractual relationships are in place for supplying agency doctors and who is responsible for managing them?
- A1 There is a Tier 1 contract in place for doctors via Health Trust Europe Total Workforce Solutions II framework. Joanne Roberts = Deputy Director of Procurement is the Procurement Lead for this contract
- Q2 Who is your primary point of contact for decision making regarding supply chain for Agency Doctors?







A2 No one person is responsible for making decisions about the supply chain for agency doctors. The supply chain is decided following a competitive exercise and then the Trust approve the award of the contract

Q3 How many agencies are used to supply agency doctors?

- A3 All of the suppliers are available to the Trust on the Health Trust Europe Total Workforce Solutions II framework. There are 85 suppliers on the framework
- Q4 Of these agencies, how many are off framework please list them?
- A4 None
- Q5 Over the past 6 months, how many shifts have been filled via an off framework agency?
- A5 As answer 4
- Q6 Who is your highest paid agency doctor, what is their speciality and their hourly charge?
- A6 Consultant Oncologist at £167.28 total hourly charge
- Q7 Please outline your spend per agency, broken down by grade and speciality of doctor over the past 6 months?
- A7 Refer to the attached spread sheet
- Q8 Do you have a Master Vendor for Agency Doctors In place? If so, who are they and when are they contracted until?
- A8 No there is no Master Vendor in place
- Q9 If you have a Master Vendor in place, what is your current average % fill rate from your Master Vendor Provider for Medical Locums for the past 6 months?
- A9 As answer 8
- Q10 If you have a Master Vendor in place, how many hours of work for medical locums have been booked outside of your Master Vendor arrangement in the past 6 months?
- A10 As answer 8
- Q11 If you have a Master Vendor in place, what % of bookings by your Master Vendor Provider are at the NHSI capped rates in the past 6 months?
- A11 As answer 8
- Q12 What is your total (£) off framework agency spend for Agency Doctors?
- A12 As answer 8

- A13 Yes, PWC Clarity
- Q14 What % of Agency Doctors are paid via Direct Engagement Method? And Outside of Direct Engagement?
- A14 99% are via DE and 1% is outside of DE
- Q15 How many doctors working are Deemed Outside of IR35 working at the Trust?
- A15 None
