I am writing to acknowledge receipt of your email dated 13<sup>th</sup> February 2023 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding EPRR Team contact information

As of 1<sup>st</sup> November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

I am conducting a study of the emergency preparedness of NHS Acute Trusts in England. I am using the emergency and disaster management module of the Hospital Safety Index checklist of the World Health Organisation. The study is part of an MSc in Crisis & Disaster Management at the University of Portsmouth.

I am writing to request a contact e-mail address for the Trust's Emergency Preparedness, Resilience and Response staff in order that I can discuss seeking further information for my study from them.

Please note that I am not requesting any personal information that would breach data protection rules.

A1 The FOI Act is in place to answer corporate information that is in the public interest, staff at an Acute hospital would expect their information not to be released to the general public for them to be contacted to discuss process outside of the review process set in place by the Trust, therefore we are refusing this request.

The exemption which has been relied upon is section 40(2) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 with regards to the name, job title email address of the individual. The disclosure of this information is subject to balancing the legitimate interest to disclose against the rights of the individuals. Upon balancing these two factors, we have found that the







rights of the individual outweigh the legitimate interest to disclose. Therefore, it would be unfair to the data subject if this information is disclosed. The disclosure of the name, job title, and email address would not add anything further to this request for information.

Furthermore, it would be unfair to disclose the name, job title, email address of the individual to the general public. The individual would expect a right to privacy. They would only expect that their name, job title and email address are disclosed to the relevant people in connection with Trust business and also in relation to the discharge of the responsibilities involved in their post. It would not be reasonable to disclose their name, job title and email address to the general public. Furthermore, the release of this information may also lead to a greater number of unsolicited correspondences.

The first condition under section 40(3A) has been contravened as it would not be fair to disclose the name, job title, and email address of the individual. Therefore, the name, job title, number and email address of the individual, has been withheld.

\*Please note that any individuals identified do not give consent for their personal data to be processed for the purposes of direct marketing.

UHNM NHS Trust is a public sector body and governed by EU law. FOI requestors should note that any new Trust requirements over the EU threshold will be subject to these regulations and will be advertised for open competition accordingly.
