I am writing to acknowledge receipt of your email dated 13th December 2021 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding Clotting Disorders

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

Q1 Could you please provide answers to the following four questions related to the incidence and treatment of clotting disorders?


