As Q1 currently but with the formation of the North Midlands MND Care and Research Network, this is likely to increase. This will include some areas currently covered by the Birmingham MND Care Centre (based at the Queen Elizabeth Hospital), for example people living in South Staffordshire. No specific numbers are available at this point as to how many more people will be served by the North Midlands Care & Research Network as it develops, but potentially more than double the current / recent numbers. The Respiratory team already cover a very big geographical area including all of the West Midlands.

5. How many newly diagnosed patients with MND were referred to the organisation in each of the last three years?

a. 2017

MND CNS team - new referrals 46.

MND CNS team - current caseload = 80

Respiratory service - additional 289 known to Respiratory team.

Patients under the care of both MND CNS team and Respiratory team only counted once.

Yes, as of June 2018 we have this status and receive funding from the Motor Neurone Disease Association. However, we are called a Network rather than a Centre (as in Norfolk, South Wales and other areas).

- 9. In your organisation, are patients with MND seen in specialist clinics? With the creation of the North Midlands MND Care & Research Network, these are in the process of being set up. The plan is for these to be across the Network, (ie Stoke, Stafford, Crewe, South Staffs)

 - a. Where are the MND specialist clinics in your organisation held? Plan County Hospital (Stafford), Royal Stoke Hospital, considering MDT clinics in Hospices across Network.
 - b. How often are the MND specialist clinics in your organisation held? Plan in different areas, monthly increasing to bi-monthly dependent on patient numbers / need.
 - c. How often are patients routinely reviewed in the MND specialist clinics? Expectation is for patients to be seen approximately 3 monthly potentially more frequently or less frequently dependent on need. With the availability of home visits by MND Clinical Nurse Specialists in-between clinic appointments or as the disease progresses and patients may struggle to attend clinic, again, dependent on patient need.

We also link with Community services / hospices (non UHNM) who attend MDT meetings to discuss patients across the Network area (regular MND specific MDT meetings are held regularly in Stoke, Stone (Stafford & Stone), Nantwich (Crewe & Nantwich), Lichfield at Samuel Johnson Hospital and also at St Giles Hospice (patients from a wider geographical area discussed at St Giles MDT meeting, due to bigger catchment area).
