I am writing to acknowledge receipt of your email dated 23<sup>rd</sup> July 2021 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding dog bites.

On 27<sup>th</sup> July 2021 we contacted you via email as we required clarification on what you meant by 'stuck by a dog'

On the same day you replied via email with:  
'Please note this should read "struck" rather than stuck.'

I can neither confirm nor deny whether the information you have requested is held by the Trust in its entirety. This is because some of the information requested in your questions is not held centrally, but may be recorded in individual health records. In order to confirm whether this information is held we would therefore have to individually access all health records within the Trust and extract the information where it is present. We therefore estimate that complying with your request is exempt under section 12 of the FOI Act: *cost of compliance is excessive*. The section 12 exemption applies when it is estimated a request will take in excess of 18 hours to complete. We estimate that accessing and reviewing all health records and then extracting relevant information would take longer than the 18 hours allowed for. In addition to the section 12 exemption the Trust is also applying section 14 (1) exemption: *oppressive burden on the authority*

Under section 16 of the FOI Act we are required to provide requestors with advice and assistance where possible. We would therefore like to advise you that if your request is shortened to just questions 1 and 3 we are able to comply within the 18 hour time frame. In order to avoid delay to your response we have provided this below.

As of 1<sup>st</sup> November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

**Q1 I am writing to make an open government request for all the information to which I am entitled under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.**

**1. For 2021; by the Hospitals in your Trust please can I receive a monthly breakdown on the number of people visiting hospitals having been "Bitten or stuck by a dog"**

**I understand that request 1 asks for information relating to 2021. Please provide me with the most recent figures in your Trust’s database.**

A1 We sought clarification as to what you meant by “stuck by a dog” – this should have read “Struck by a dog”.

With regards to the questions we have taken “visiting” as meaning attending the AE department.

There is no way to identify people who are “struck” therefore we are unable to give information relating to this part of the question.

In relation to the dog bite part of the question we only record that a person has been bitten, we do not record how the bite was sustained, however in the triage notes staff sometimes write how the bite was sustained, therefore we have looked for the word “dog” please note if this has been misspelt or the word dog does not appear in the triage notes then these patients will not be included.

The only alternative way would be to manually review every patient who has been bitten and ascertain to see how the bite was sustained as it might be held in patients notes = section 12 exemption as detailed above.

For the information we can identify using the above criteria here is the information for all questions: - We are unable to provide some of the information you require in the requested format as to release this data could lead to the identification of the person(s) involved due to the low numbers involved, and would breach the Trusts obligations under Data Protection Act 2018. Accordingly, this aspect of your request is exempt from disclosure under the terms of Section 40(2) of the FOI Act. *Personal information*. However as the Trust is committed to openness and transparency we can band the numbers as being <5.

This exemption is an absolute exemption and therefore no consideration of the public interest test is needed.

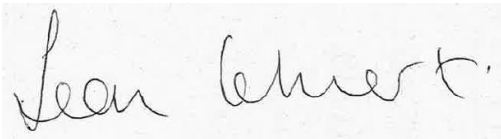
