Q1 Please may you provide me with the information for the following:

Does University Hospitals North Midlands NHS Foundation Trust use single use endoscopes for any of its endoscopy procedures?

- a. If so, can you state in which procedures they are used?
- b. If so, can you state which brand/s of endoscopes are used?
- A1 We do not use single use scopes in endoscopy
- Q2 Can University Hospitals North Midlands NHS Foundation Trust state how many single use endoscopes have been used in 2021, 2022, 2023 and 2024?
- A2 Within endoscopy department we use reusable scopes only.
- Q3 Can University Hospitals North Midlands NHS Foundation Trust state how many single use endoscopes are planned to be used in 2024, 2025, and 2026.
- A3 None
- Q4 Does University Hospitals North Midlands NHS Foundation Trust have plans to increase the use of single use endoscopes to help in the delivery of Community Diagnostic Centres and temporary out-of-hours hubs to reduce waiting lists?
- A4 No
