I am writing in response to your email dated 3oth April 2020 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding fit tests

On our acknowledgment we added the following statement:

The University Hospitals of North Midlands Trust is committed to the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

However, the NHS is facing unprecedented challenges relating to the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic at the current time. Understandably, our resources have been diverted to support our front-line colleagues who are working tremendously hard to provide care for our patients, and to those in need of our services.

We strive to be transparent and to work with an open culture. But at this time, whilst care of our patients and the safety of our staff takes precedent, it is likely that responses to some requests for information will be delayed. We apologise for this position in advance, and will endeavour to provide you with as much information as we can, as soon as we are able.

The Information Commissioners Office has recognised the current situation in the NHS.

On 4th May 2020 you contacted us via email with the following clarification: "Thank you for your response. I understand that there may be a delay in your response given the current circs. I would also like to clarify my request: when I say "sex-breakdown" I am looking for the proportion of male versus female staff rather than numbers of each".

I can neither confirm nor deny whether the information you have requested is held by the Trust in its entirety. This is because the information requested in questions 1-5 is not held centrally, but may be recorded in individual staff/health records. In order to confirm whether this information is held we would therefore have to individually access all individual staff/health records within the Trust and extract the information where it is present. We therefore estimate that complying with your request is exempt under section 12 of the FOI Act: cost of compliance is excessive. The section 12 exemption applies when it is estimated a request will take in excess of 18 hours to complete. We estimate that accessing and reviewing all individual staff/health records and then extracting relevant information would take longer than the 18 hours allowed for.

In addition to the section 12 exemption the Trust is also applying section 14 (1) exemption: *oppressive* burden on the authority

Under section 16 of the FOI Act we are required to provide requestors with advice and assistance where possible. We would therefore like to advise you that if your request is shortened to just question







6 we are able to comply within the 18 hour time frame. In order to avoid delay to your response we have provided this below.

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

- Q1 I would like to be provided with:
 - 1) The sex-breakdown of all those who failed fit tests for all available masks at your Trust between 1st February 2020 and 30th April 2020.
- A1 Section 12 and 14 exemptions as detailed above
- Q2 The sex-breakdown of all those who had to use a powered air purifying respirator at your Trust between 1st February 2020 and 30th April 2020.
- A2 As answer 1
- Q3 The sex-breakdown of all those who failed their fit test for a FFP3 mask at your Trust between 1st February 2020 and 30th April 2020.
- A3 As answer 1
- 4) the sex breakdown of all those who failed their fit test for a Disposable Healthcare Respirator, FFP3, valved, 1873V+ at your Trust between 1st February 2020 and 30th April 2020.
- A4 As answer 1
- Q5 The sex breakdown of all those who failed their fit test for a Disposable Healthcare Respirator, FFP3, Type IIR, 1863+ at your trust between 1st February 2020 and 30th April 2020.
- A5 As answer 1
- Q6 Finally, during the period 1st February 2020 to 30th April 2020, has your Trust been doing fit tests or just fit checks?
- A6 The Trust has been carrying out fit tests during the time period requested.
