I am writing to acknowledge receipt of your email dated 13th May 2021 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding virtual and augmented reality in healthcare

The University Hospitals of North Midlands Trust is committed to the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

However, the NHS is facing unprecedented challenges relating to the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic at the current time. Understandably, our resources have been diverted to support our front-line colleagues who are working tremendously hard to provide care for our patients, and to those in need of our services.

We strive to be transparent and to work with an open culture. But at this time, whilst care of our patients and the safety of our staff takes precedent, it is likely that responses to some requests for information will be delayed. We apologise for this position in advance, and will endeavour to provide you with as much information as we can, as soon as we are able.

The Information Commissioners Office has recognised the current situation in the NHS

On 19th May 2021 we contacted you as we required the following clarification:

Q1, Are you asking if we have these positions at the Trust or are you asking for the headcount or full time equivalent (fte)?

On the same day you replied via email with:

'We are enquiring with regard to the current headcount – how many people you have within those roles currently at the Trust.'

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UJNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

Q1 How many of the following positions do you currently employ at the Trust?

- a) Core training doctor (CT1 and CT2)
- b) Specialty surgical registrar (StR)
- c) Career grade surgeon

A1 See below:

Core training doctor	49
Specialty Registrar - surgical	69
Trust Grade	115

Q2 Do you currently use augmented reality or virtual reality technologies within the Trust as a training / educational tool for medical education?

If yes, which technology?

A2 We have 3 desk top PCs that are set up to run virtual reality training via headsets and this is used currently for Diabetes training funded by HEEWM. We have no other examples at present

Q3 Do you currently use augmented reality or virtual reality technologies within the Trust as a surgical planning tool?

If yes, which technology?

A3 No

Should you have a complaint about the response or the handling of your request, please also contact my office to request a review of this. If having exhausted the Trust's FOIA complaints process you are

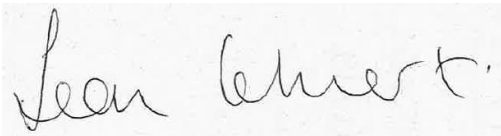
still not satisfied, you are entitled to approach the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) and request an assessment of the manner in which the Trust has managed your request.
