I am writing to acknowledge receipt of your email dated 3rd May 2021(received into our office 4th May 2021) requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding Prof. Baker (FOI request response reference 007-2122)

The University Hospitals of North Midlands Trust is committed to the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

However, the NHS is facing unprecedented challenges relating to the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic at the current time. Understandably, our resources have been diverted to support our front-line colleagues who are working tremendously hard to provide care for our patients, and to those in need of our services.

We strive to be transparent and to work with an open culture. But at this time, whilst care of our patients and the safety of our staff takes precedent, it is likely that responses to some requests for information will be delayed. As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

Keele University was the lead sponsor for this project. Professor Philip Baker was a research Professor that was the Chief Investigator for this project. He was not directly involved on a day to day basis.

The Principal Investigator for this study was Professor O'Brien as the previous FOI response given. The other members of the team that worked on this project were all registered research midwives that had employment contracts. The procedures were undertaken by these members of staff.

STRIDER

University of Liverpool were the Sponsor of this project. An amendment was submitted by the Sponsor to change the Principal Investigator from Professor Philip Baker to Mrs Geraldine Masson.

The Principal Investigator for this project was Mrs Geraldine Masson, Consultant Obstetrician. The other members of the team that worked on this project were registered research midwives
