I am writing in response to your email dated 19th May 2019 (received into our office 20th May) requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding Histology productivity and digital pathology usage.

On 20th May 2019 we contacted you via email as UHNM is unable to open survey links or respond to FOI request made this way, due to cyber security and the procedures we have in place to validate the information we release.

We are more than happy to answer your request if you are able to put into a word document/ spread sheet or in the body of an email.

On the same day you provided a word document via email.

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

- I am writing to you under the Freedom of Information Act to request the following information on cellular pathology services [Histology]

 The information request takes the form of a questionnaire, answers to this will form the basis of a PhD project that I am currently completing at examining how digital pathology systems are affecting/will affect histology services in the UK (NHS). I also work in the NHS (in histology) and understand the time pressures faced, I have therefore tried to make this as simple and easy to complete as possible. If you can identify any ways that my request could be refined, I would be grateful for any further advice and assistance.
